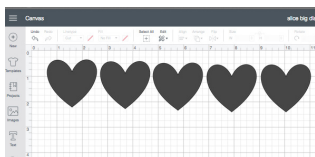


CUTTING MACHINES, IRON ON VINYL & COSPLAY



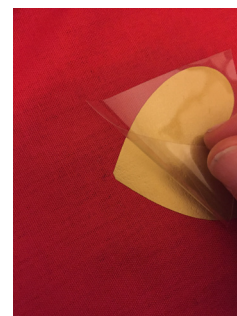
1. Prep your .svg files and place in your cutting program at correct size. (if using text, make sure text is flipped)
Cut out your design on the machine



2. Preheat your iron!
While you wait, weed your design from the backing. Iron your fabric and make markings using a fabric pencil on where they will be placed.



3. Protect your iron on vinyl, plastic and fabric by using baking paper. Apply pressure with the iron for approx. 30 seconds (longer depending on design)



4. Once slightly cool, gently remove the plastic layer from the top. If there is any lifting of the vinyl, reapply the baking paper and gently iron.



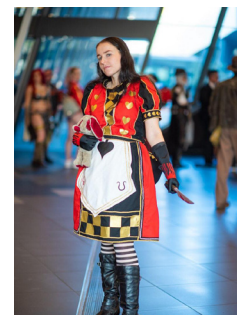
5. Repeat until you have completed all of your iron on.
When ironing in future, always protect your design with baking paper



6. Iron on can easily be sewn as well! If you want to add an extra bit of bling to your cosplay, add some trims. Don't be afraid to add!



7. Step back and admire your work in progress! Not only does vinyl look great, it will save you so much time! Also great for those nitty gritty little details!



8. Time to wear your cosplay proudly!
